



Scripture Union Fiji releases our first home written devotional



Mrs. Emi Rabukawaqa and her Publications Team of the SU Council and friends, laboured tirelessly to complete this titanic project which required months of writing and seeking the Lord for inspired words to pen into this devotional. After all, this was the first ever locally produced devotional written by Scripture Union in Fiji as a Bible study tool or aid for young people and families. This was a huge project as Mrs Rabukawaqa's team sought devotional writers, went through an editing process and the negotiations with very little or almost no funds to take the document into produc-

tion. Yet with Faith as a currency, we now have this "first locally produced authored SU Bible reading guide and we give thanks, glory and honour to God for His love and mercy in answering prayer and for gracing His people with humility and patience to endure and bring to completion that which was seemingly out of reach", Mrs Rabukawaqa wrote. She further added that, "we appreciate and praise God for the lives of the men and women who wrote the devotions in the Daily Challenge. They made sacrifices of time in prayer and in studying the Word and in seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit to be able to compose such timely Word from God's heart."

The devotional combines sharing on the Word as well as some personal reflections from some of Scripture Union's volunteers. This is a great Quite Time tool and contains key Bible verses for the day, a reflection of the verse and a prayer guide. Further the devotional is written to be relevant to perpetuity and for a seeker, it will also enable them to read the Bible in on year. The daily revelations will undoubtedly provide the much needed boast for any Christian ready to starting their day or together as a family at evening prayers. The Daily Challenge is also one of the cheapest devotionals in



our market today in Fiji and to invest in a copy is not just to invest in your spiritual life, but it is also planting a seed to the work of Scripture Union that will continue to allow us to design and deliver relevant ministry tools to assist us in our mission with young people and families in our nation. 

Keni's daring dream and relentless faith finally saw him dance at the Feast of Tabernacles last month and walk the streets that Jesus walked in Jerusalem and surrounding towns including Capernaum, Galilee etc. Here's his reflection titled; **Living a legacy**



Thank you Lord for the opportunity. I humbly ask for our leadership oh God. Help me and guide me to inderstand your will for me in this opportunity n lessing you have given me.



"Legacy is not leaving something for people, its leaving something in people" In a devotion one morning at the Yitzhak Rabin Hostel, our dance coordinator Chloe Gonzalez shared about "Living a legacy of a farmer in Gods kingdom." As farmers, we plant seeds and wait for it to grow and later bear its fruits. As volunteers at the feast, she encouraged us to be farmers that will plant seeds of faith, peace, hope and love to people as we serve them in different roles and responsibilities we are in. To plant seeds that will help the nations that have come to grow spiritually and bear fruits of the spirit. This encouraged me as a first time dancer to the feast to sow seeds in peoples lives from all over the world on behalf of the nation of Fiji. Coming to Israel was an exciting and challenging experience for me as it was my first time travelling alone to 2 foreign countries, Korea and Israel. It really challenged my relationship of trust with God and I am thankful that in all the challenges i faced, God kept assuring his presence and company all throughout the journey. I was reminded that at times God separates us from what we are use to and wants time alone with us. God is always speaking, tune out doubt, unbelief and distractions so you can tune in and hear his voice. Another exciting experience was joining the Feast of the Tabernacle dance company which was really amazing and so much fun.

Although the dance choreographies were a whole lot different, I thank God for the lives of the dance directors and team members for the team bonding and help that made it easier for me to learn. There was a lot to learn during rehearsals but at the same time a whole lot of fun and great friendship built-in. One of the amazing experience ever in this trip to Israel was dancing in front of approximately 5000 plus people from different nations at the Pais Arena and declaring Gods sovereignty, power and blessing over them and their nations. It was such a great opportunity and blessing to witness God move in peoples lives through healing, blessing and anointing and transformation. Such a great joy to have the opportunity to minister through dance to people and i thank God for such a season as this. "Living a legacy of sowing seeds of blessing." Please think about your legacy because you're writing it today.

Legacy is not what's left tomorrow when you're gone, its what you give, create, impact and contribute today while you're here that then happens to live on. People say, "Living a Christian legacy is hard" but i tell you its a process of building you up to be a better man or woman of God. "Unless the Lord builds the house, its builders labour in When the Lord builds the house, He gets the glory because stand guard in vain. In vain you rise early and stay up late, toiling for food to eat - for He grants sleep to those He loves" (Psalm 127:1-2).

God is telling us there is a way of working without striving. There is a way to conduct business without sweating and toiling for outcome. His warning to each of us is to avoid thinking that outcome is based on our sweat and toil. Outcome is based on obedience. That outcome is sometimes more than we deserve. Sometimes it is less than we hoped for. His desire for each of us is to see Him working in our daily work life. He wants us to avoid looking to our own The day we find ourselves in that situation/position, we've effort to gain an outcome.

One day Jesus called out to Peter from the shore of the

lake and suggested he throw his net on the other side of the boat. It was this simple act of obedience that yielded a tremendous catch that he would not have received unless he obeyed.

We are called to work; He is called to bring forth the fruit. He is the vine. We are the branches. Fruit comes forth naturally from a healthy tree.



If we are not connected to (living in obedience) to the tree, we will pay the price for it. Several reasons why it is important for us to allow Him to build whatever it is we are aiming for are:
