Young Professional acknowledges, it's God

Naibuka Saune, is a young professional whose journey of faith is matched by his own personal commitment to Christ. For someone who has experienced the impacts of student ministry, he acknowledges the value of the work we do in schools. His own faith was strengthened by the resolve of God fearing parents and particularly so by his own personal journey as a student. He acknowledges that his journey to success is meaningless without Christ. So what is peculiar about this brother of mine. Despite his protests; a reflection of his own humility really, I coerced him for this testimony because in his life and achievements, I see how Our powerful and all sufficient God remains a driving force in his life. My friendship with Naibuka started in 2008 when we were on a pilgrimage to Israel. At the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem, this young man was laying his life before the Lord and committing his

academic journey to Him. Fast forward and this last month, Naibuka graduated with a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Accounting from Australia. His aim was to achieve this academic feat before he turned 30 and this young man has not only fulfilled this but today testifies to the goodness and faithfulness of God through his academic and life generally as a young man. In sharing His faith and love for God with us, Naibuka' s testimony is a reminder of the Mighty things God is doing in lives that are sold out to Him. It is not hard to see the handiwork of God in Naibuka's life and for someone as young and passionate for God as he is, it is timely reminder to "not get caught up in the details" but live a life that Honours God and watch Him move in those areas that are surrendered



to him. His successes are but a reminder, that we serve a God of Excellence. SU Fiji is proud of his achievements and wishes Naibuka well in His endeavours especially so as Christ's ambassador to the young and old alike.

How do you see your faith in God?

My Faith in God is my only HOPE. That being said, my walk with the Lord If I am honest is characterized by one of ups and down, probably more of the later rather than the former. I am very thankful that HE is always true to HIS Word in that He will never leave me nor forsake me. His endless love and forgiveness for a sinner like me gives me hope and His promises is not a "wish" or a vain "I hope so" but is firm and secure. As a young man, what is your advise to other young people on this journey of life?

First and foremost, to build yourself a steady foundation by having Jesus as your "Rock" (Rom. 9:33; 1 Cor 10:2-4) and your "Cornerstone" (Is. 28:16, 1 Pet. 2:6). Surround yourselves with positive and value adding people. People you associate with will have a huge impact and influence on the choices you make. This life is for the taking. What you sow you shall reap. If you want to see or reap a desired outcome/harvest then sow the seed appropriate for the harvest you seek. Finally, don't get too engrossed in the details of life that you forget to live and enjoy the wonderful gift of Life that God has given you. Make use of opportunities that come your way and HAVE FUN

What are the secrets of your academic success?

Honestly, I don't know. I cannot put my finger on a specific variable so as to speak, but combination of variables. These factors are not novel or new but just old verbs, ranging from hard work, commitment, being disciplined with one's time, tenacity /persistence. But one thing I am certain about, albeit unfathomable, is the unmerited favor of God. I could say that this has been the x-factor in my life and all glory and honor is rightfully due to HIM ALONE. HIS favor propels you in to places and situations which leave you in awe. I am always reminded of the truth in Ephesians 3.20 "God "is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us."



Scripture Union Regional Conference: Sydney, Australia (from 23rd May)

Winter is here and so are delegates from Pacific Island countries and within Australia as we converge into beautiful Sydney for the SU Regional Conference. This is an important gathering as Pacific leaders discuss the exciting changes ahead for Scripture Union's global movement. You see as Pacific Islanders or nation-



al movements, our missions are largely focussed on the local and that is not a bad thing, however this week, we are reminded that Scripture Union is a global movement with global and especially national impacts. Our history began in June 1867 when Josiah Spiers, a young British youth worker from London spoke to a group of 15 children in a drawing room in Islington, London about Christ. This began a pioneering vision of sharing Christ with children and from that one meeting, it grew rapidly and that gathering birthed the Children's Special Service Mission (CSSM) later to become Scripture Union. Spier's legacy remains of SU being a driving force for Scriptural

studies for young people and families.

Today the movement has its presence in 130 countries with Pacific movements in Australia NZ, Fiji, Tonga, PNG, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu. The impact of SU through the lives of many remains profound The Conference provided an opportunity for delegates to consider the expected changes for Scripture Union International and to prepare the Pacific region in this transitional phase as SU moves to strengthen its global mission while working closer together as the SU Movements. It was a time of encouragement, edification and appreciation as we reminded each other the value of our work, the power of our mission and the honour of our calling. The delegates acknowledged the invaluable work of our Pacific Islands Regional Director Lloyd Carter, who after years of valuable service at SU is now taking his much deserved retirement. Lloyd is one of SU's modern hero who has stirred the regional leadership of SU through some of our most troubling seasons. He now rides into the sunset but keeping his options open for pastoral callings and wherever the Lord will lead him and his wife Jenny into. We also acknowledged the good leadership of our Pacific team led by Wayne Fraser of New Zealand SU and our Pacific Coordinator Sam Emery (insert) fondly known as Papa Sam in the Solomon Islands. SU International Director, Janet Morgan (insert) reminded the Pacific delegates of the incredible leadership that God has raised up in this region. "This regional has released people to work with us on this amazing journey" she adds. While the transitional phase of SU is continuing and at the moment it is unclear until the International Council meeting in September what the new governance structure of SU International will look like, there is "hopeful certainty because we are clear about our calling and we know that our calling is from God" Janet adds. At the end of the consultation, delegates expressed their "parting words" which were filled with apprehension, excitement, caution and optimism of SU's journey ahead. Wayne Fraser (SU NZ Director) was re-elected as SU's Pacific Council Director and our National Director, Sisa Teilai was re-elected into the Pacific Council. Sam Emery also remains part of the Pacific Council.

Amini as he is fondly known is a hydrologist by trade, working with the SPC SOPAC division based in Tarawa. Together with his wife, Salome and young children, a son, Ratu Ovini and a daughter, Katarina, the Loco family has served amongst the communities of Kiribati in mapping and finding suitable drinking water for the remote islands as well as within the mainland of Kiribati under a EU funded project. However my association with this brother of mine, dates back to High School where we

both served in the school's SUIS group. He was not only my CF

sion and love for the Lord. As our CF leader, he was not only committed to ensuring a united SUIS group, but ensuring that our members were growing in our faith through our involvement in the WORD and in our weekly fellowships. We both left High School in 1998 to attend USP Foundation but by then our spiritual foundation in Christ was well laid out and the journey we took from there was one filled with blessings, grace and purpose in Christ. Our SUIS days strengthened our own resolve in Christ and through Bible Study, Saturday Night SUIS, morning prayer meetings, action song practice as we pre-

pared for Sunday church service, strengthened our mutual interest in building our spiritual walk. Our life's journey is filled with testimonies of our personal encounters with God and a lot of that is because of the spiritual nurturing during our SUIS days. Today, the Loco family remain connected with Scripture Union by supporting our programs. Responding to the pleas for financial assistance from the ministry, the distance from Kiribati has not prevented his family from investing into the work of Scripture Union in Schools (SUIS) and as they listen to the update and the work of the Ministry in Fiji, his response is one filled with praises and admiration for the many people who remain steadfast and committed to the vision of Scripture Union. His is a life that was greatly impacted by the ministry of Scripture Union and if anything is to go by from that experience, it was his relationship with God, developed through the study of His Word and the joy of being in a fellowship environment through the ministry of SUIS that has shaped and moulded Amini to be the man of faith that he is today. Together with his beautiful wife, Salome, this young couple rejoice in serving the Lord even when it can be difficult in their current environment. As I spent time with them in Kiribati, I realised that the years have not changed their perspective for God, in fact it is through their experiences, especially with the Scripture Union in Schools ministry that have made their dependency on God stronger. The Loco family as a Partner of Scripture Union supports us in the Great Commission in schools and through our partnerships, we are seeing lives changed for the King.
