SUVA SCHOOL WORKING GROUP BIBLE STUDY

WISDOM:

Wisdom is defined as the quality of having experience, knowledge, and good judgment; the quality of being wise. There are powerful examples of bible heroes whose life was a testimony of Wisdom. In 2 Chronicles 1: 7-11, we have this powerful encounter between the man that becomes the wisest man on earth and the Almighty.

⁷ That night God appeared to Solomon and said to him, "Ask for whatever you want me to give you." ⁸ Solomon answered God, "You have shown great kindness to David my father and have made me king in his place. ⁹ Now, LORD God, let your promise to my father David be confirmed, for you have made me king over a people who are as numerous as the dust of the earth. ¹⁰ Give me wisdom and knowledge, that I may lead this people, for who is able to govern this great people of yours?"

¹¹ God said to Solomon, "Since this is your heart's desire and you have not asked for wealth, possessions or honour, nor for the death of your enemies, and since you have not asked for a long life but for wisdom and knowledge to govern my people over whom I have made you king, ¹² therefore wisdom and knowledge will be given you. And I will also give you wealth, possessions and honour, such as no king who was before you ever had and none after you will have."

She is <u>more precious than jewels</u>; and nothing you desire compares with her. <u>Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honor</u>. Her ways are <u>pleasant ways</u>, and all her <u>paths are peace</u>. She is a tree of life to those who take hold of her, and happy are all who hold her fast. (NAS, Proverbs 3:13-18)

- 33 Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and unfathomable His ways! (<u>Romans 11:33</u>; see also <u>Job</u> <u>9:1-4; 36:5</u>; <u>Isaiah 31:1-2</u>).
